Personal Injury

Aliyah is known for her cutting-edge work in some of the more complex areas of personal injury law, including product liability and international personal injury.

She regularly acts in claims involving brain injuries. She has acted for claimants who have suffered traumatic brain injury in road traffic and cycling accidents. She is currently instructed in a claim on behalf of a girl who nearly drowned in a swimming pool while on holiday in Spain and suffered a catastrophic brain injury.

Aliyah has particular expertise in fatal accident claims. She has real experience of how the Courts deal with these cases having appeared in a number of significant High Court cases. She has recently acted for the families of a teenager involved in a go-karting accident and a mother killed in a hit and run accident.

She has worked on claims involving harmful environmental exposures, including 'sick building syndrome' case, a condition developed as a result of living in a defective new build home and claims involving mould and asthma.

Industrial Disease

Aliyah has appeared in the Court of Appeal and in numerous High Court trials for mesothelioma claimants. She is the junior of choice for ground-breaking cases, including product liability claims against a major asbestos manufacturer and a test case which seeks to redefine public liability insurance for asbestos claims. She has significant expertise in cases involving issues surrounding immunotherapy costs.

Her industrial disease practice crosses over with her international law expertise in a number of claims brought by South African claimants exposed to asbestos from mining operations.

She also represents serving and former military personnel in claims arising from non-freezing cold injuries and noise-induced hearing loss.

Group Litigation
