Serious Injury

DC (deceased). High-value fatal accident, clinical negligence claim. Claimant dying following emergency liver transplant surgery and with acute liver failure, resulting in multiple organ failure, following negligent prescription of Methotrexate and Leflunomide, without adequate monitoring and supervision. Settled at mediation

RH (deceased). High Court trial on behalf of deceased that died as a result of a delay in the diagnosis of cervical cancer.

AJ. Claimant suffering delay in diagnosis of Charcot's foot at her right foot that has caused ongoing effects. Consideration in addition of subsequent fracture dislocation of the left ankle that involved attempted fusion surgery and amputation of the left fourth toe. The effects of the negligence including permanent deformity at the right foot and mid-foot collapse and persistent problems in respect of mobility, amenity and upon future employment.

Recently Concluded Cases

- (*a protected party*) v *Straine*- approved settlement of £2,500,000 in a claim by a profoundly injured motorist who had suffered brain damage and with liability in dispute.
- DC on behalf of RH, deceased – High-value clinical negligence claim heard at trial in the High Court and involving death following delay in the diagnosis of cervical cancer
- GXM on behalf of JXM, a protected party-Approval of settlement before HHJ Mark Gargan, Clinical negligence claim involving failure to treat sepsis and acquired brain injury with profound disabling effects
- AM -Acting for Defendant in multi-million-pound claim involving serious brain injury after a fall from height in an accident at work.
- PN on behalf of AN (Deceased) – Acting for widower following the removal of life support for his wife, involving significant fatal accident, clinical negligence and human rights claims. Settlement reached at round table mediation.
