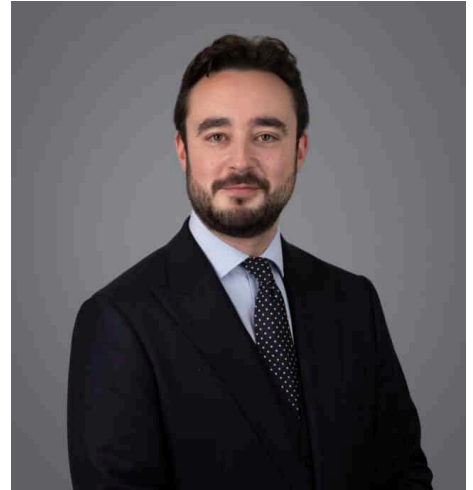

He was appointed directly to the Attorney General's Regional B Panel in 2023.
